## Reminder on the requirements of fishermen's basic training.

Anybody starting work on a UK registered fishing vessel, either a new start or a fisherman from abroad, must complete the following training:

Seafish Sea Survival or STCW Personal Survival Techniques.

Within 3 months of completing the Sea Survival the following must be completed:

- Elementary First Aid (Seafish or STCW);
- Fire fighting (Seafish or STCW);
- Seafish Basic Health and Safety (there is no other equivalent to the Seafish course).

The Safety Awareness course MUST be attended between 6 months and 2 years after starting work as a fisherman. The Basic Health and Safety Course must have been completed first.

All of the above courses are scheduled at the NAFC over the next few weeks:

- November 6<sup>th</sup> STCW Personal Survival Techniques
- November 7<sup>th</sup> Safety Awareness (Seafish)
- November 8<sup>th</sup> Fire Fighting (Seafish)
- November 9<sup>th</sup> Elementary First Aid (STCW)
- November 27<sup>th</sup> Basic Health and Safety
- December 1<sup>st</sup> Safety Awareness
